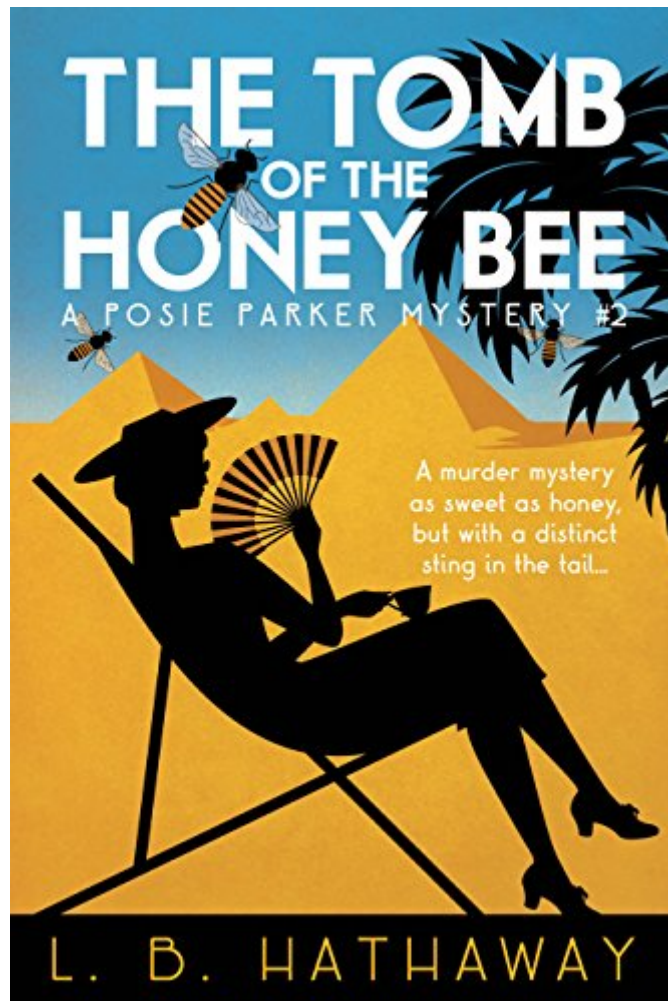


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The Tomb Of The Honey Bee: A Posie Parker Mystery (The Posie Parker Mystery Series Book 2)

This is the second book in this series. Although fun reading, I was amazed that the phrase, "retail therapy " was used In a book based in the 1920's. With all the research to be era specific, I found this to be jarringly inconsistent since the phrase was not used until the 1980's. Hence, the three stars.

I have now read the first 2 books of the series set in 1921. I enjoy mysteries set in the 1920s and 1930s, but these books have too many anachronisms and that interferes with the suspension of disbelief required for historical fiction. Just 2 examples from "The Tomb of the Honey Bee": 1. A jet trainer in 1921? The first jet was flown in 1939. Any reader who has ever watched a movie set in WWI would not accept that. 2. A Texas oil millionaire who expects air conditioning in an English country house. Residential window box air conditioners were not invented until 1931 and cost \$10,000-50,000 per unit in 1932, equivalent to \$110,000-160,000 today. The first book also had anachronisms. These kind of errors, including period-inappropriate colloquialisms, are major stumbling blocks to the reader in remaining in the setting. The author's biography states that she is interested in history and contributes to history magazines. I hope she does a better job of researching those articles than she does these books. Although there are additional books available in the series, I am done with it..

I enjoy historical mysteries when some care has been taken to be historically accurate. This author claims expertise in history, and perhaps in the sense of being aware of political situations in Great Britain in the 1920s she can reasonably make that claim. But the day-to-day details in the book are wrong enough to be jarring: Telegraph messages that go on and on, including postscripts, rather

than conserving word count; a person who declares herself in need of "retail therapy," a phrase first used in the 1980s; another character bemoaning the lack of central air conditioning at an English country estate. It becomes difficult as a reader to engage with a mystery if the characters themselves aren't bound by rules--will this person do what was within the norms of the time and place, or will they act in an anachronistic way? I had some trouble with this in the first book in the series, but pressed on to read the second--and that's where I hit my limit.

The Tomb of the Honeybee, a Posie Parker Mystery, by L.B. Hathaway When Alaric Boynton-Dale, the famous explorer and honey farmer disappears, his family calls astute investigator Posie Parker in to investigate and try to find him, dead or alive. Then, when the murder of a famous mystery author occurs at their home while Posie is visiting, she is tasked with finding the murderer as well. Did Alaric kill her and run away? Did a family member set to inherit a fortune kill them both? If so, why would they kill the mystery author? And, when Posie finds a mysterious very valuable coin at the scene, known to always have been worn around Alaric's neck, what does it mean? Does it implicate him as guilty? So many questions posed by Posie that you think they'll never get sorted out. A very sticky plot glued together with honey. The author takes readers on a leisurely international ramble through 1920s England, France, Italy, Egypt and back again. Again, it seems the spirit of Agatha Christie is sitting on Hathaway's shoulder. The transition to Egypt could have been smoother, and I hated the destruction that occurs in Egypt. It saddened me. The Posie Parker series, of which I have read the first two, are a lovely blend of good writing, nicely edited and without the intrusive presence of too much "filler" in the form of elongated description of relatively unimportant scenes. The pacing is thus good, and though these books are not, nor

intended to be, meant to be short-listed for the Booker Prize, they are fine enough for this retired English Professor to read with delight sans boredom. An obvious omission, perhaps intentional, is to mention the protagonists friendships and family, but perhaps that is coming. I very much like this combination of novel of manners and mystery. Bra a!

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
