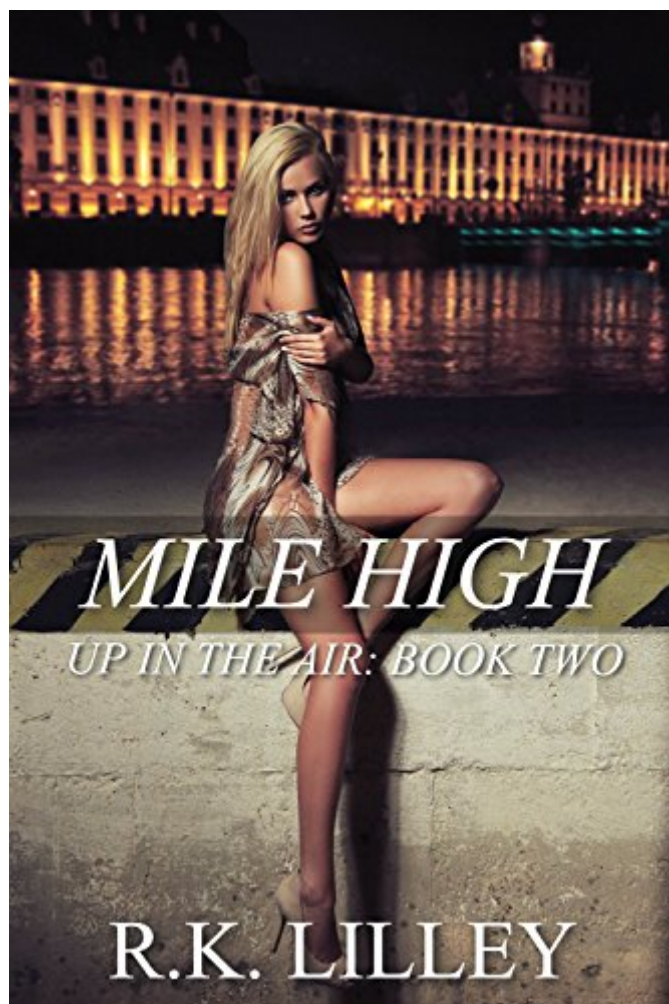


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## Mile High (Up In The Air Book 2)
